Moving to the area is an entirely different experience. So much of Georgetown's 20th century history has been word-of-mouth, small publications and museum membership lectures. Lee began to ask questions and has never stopped in her quest to find out as much as possible about how life is different along the coast of SC.

In learning of the local history, Lee has been anxious to share it with other newcomers eager to learn of the history and ecology, the great men and women, of rice and slaves, but also of small stores, family traditions and great storms.
